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Suspects in custody following a.m. stabbing

At least one possible suspect being held for extradition

The Grayson Police Department issued a statement through the Grayson City Facebook page around 11 a.m. on Monday announcing arrests related to an early morning Main Street stabbing.

According to the release, from Assistant Chief Kyle Smith, officers with the Grayson PD responded to an incident on East Main Street at approximately 2

a.m. on the morning of Monday, July 20, “in reference to a physical altercation resulting in life threatening injuries due to stabbing.”

The release went on to reassure the public that this was an isolated incident, which police were able to quickly respond to, and did not represent any danger to the wider public.

“We would like the public to know this is an isolated incident and there is no threat to the public,” the release read. “Suspects are currently in custody of the Grayson Police Department.”

The two presumed suspects were booked into the Carter County Detention Center later that same day.

Leaky roofs and sinkholes

Fiscal court discusses updates to current jail and votes to demolish old one

The Carter County Fiscal Court was made aware of the need for a new roof on the detention center during their regular meeting last Monday, July 13. Carter County Jailer R.W. Boggs spoke to the court and stressed that the need for a new roof was

immediate. Boggs provided the court with information concerning the type of repair necessary and a projected cost, but the figures supplied were general and not an actual bid for repairs.

Boggs said his information was from December of 2025, and the projected cost was \$173,000. “Now they’re up to \$230,000,” Boggs told the court. “They said materials have went up 37 percent. When I first mentioned it back in December, I about choked on \$173,00.”

Now, he told the court, he wished he had locked in that price.

“The main thing is, it’s raining inside the jail,” Boggs said. “And we have several really bad

The chicken recipe you'll use every week

I call this recipe "Every Week Chicken" because I make this chicken nearly every week for my family. And once you try this, you might do the same. Chicken breast can be troublesome because they're so lean, it's easy to overcook. You'll find this recipe produces tender, juicy chicken every time.

This is a simple recipe for oven-roasted chicken breasts. It's perfect for an easy dinner or to make in advance for meal prep all week long. Moist and flavorful, this is the chicken you want waiting in the fridge to expedite your dinner, stick in a salad, slam on a sandwich, toss in a pasta, put on a pizza. You get the idea.

This simple salt and pepper seasoning gives the chicken tons of flavor yet keeps it neutral enough to play well with other flavor profiles. As always, feel free to adjust to your personal preferences.

- EVERY WEEK CHICKEN
- 4

pounds boneless skinless chicken breast (about 6 breasts)
- 2

teaspoons kosher salt
- 1

teaspoon fresh ground pepper
- Olive oil or your choice of cooking spray

Preheat oven to 375 F degrees. For easy clean up, line a baking sheet with parchment or foil. Brush the chicken with olive oil or give it a quick spray of cooking spray. Mix the salt and pepper in a small bowl and season both sides of the chicken breasts with the mixture, then put them on the prepared baking

sheet, uncovered. Place them in oven and bake for 30 minutes. Remove the chicken when it reaches 160 F. Carryover heat will bring it to a safe final temperature while it rests. Remove the chicken and rest, covered with foil, for 15 minutes.

This cooking time works on chicken breasts of nearly all sizes, 3/4 inch to 1 1/2 inches thick. If your chicken breast is thinner than 3/4 inch thick, reduce cooking time to 25 minutes.

To store, place in a storage container with the accumulated pan juices over the chicken for flavor and to keep the chicken moist. Store in the fridge for up to five days.

So, what do you do with all that chicken? Well, besides chicken salad, sandwiches and wraps, here are three fabulous ideas:

BBQ Chicken French Bread Pizza: Split a loaf of French bread lengthwise and spread with barbecue sauce. Top with shredded mozzarella, cooked shredded chicken and chopped red onion. Bake at 400 degrees until the bread is crisp and the cheese is melted and bubbly, about 15 minutes. Finish with a drizzle of additional barbecue sauce and a sprinkle of chopped cilantro before slicing and serving.

Chicken Avocado Quesadillas: Layer shredded mozzarella, cooked chicken and diced avocado between two flour tortillas. Add a drizzle of your favorite sauce, such as ranch, barbecue or teriyaki, if you'd like. Cook in a skillet over medium heat until both sides are golden brown and the cheese is melted, then slice into wedges and serve.

Quick Chicken Alfredo: Make sliced leftover chicken into a fast comfort meal by simmering it with jarred Alfredo sauce, a splash of milk, butter and Italian seasonings. Spoon over cooked egg noodles and finish with chopped parsley.

Sometimes the simplest rec-

ipes become the ones you reach for again and again. I have a feeling this will be one of them. Enjoy!

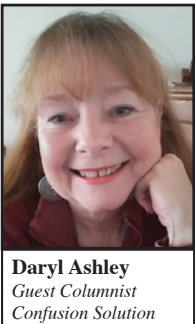

Summer maintenance tips for a thriving vegetable garden

Summer is the season when Kentucky vegetable gardens shift into high gear. Warm days and long sunlight hours push plants to grow quickly, but they also bring the challenges of heat, dry spells, weeds, insects and disease. A little steady attention now can make the difference between a struggling garden and one that produces a steady supply of fresh vegetables well into fall.

Watering is the most important task during hot weather. Vegetables grow best when the upper 6 to 8 inches of soil are thoroughly moistened, because this encourages deeper, stronger roots. Shallow watering leads to shallow roots, resulting in poor growth and an increased risk of injury during severe weather. Instead of sprinkling lightly every day, give your garden a slow, deep soaking once or twice a week, depending on rainfall. Early morning is the best time to water so leaves can dry quickly, reducing the chance of disease.

Mulching is another powerful tool for summer success. A layer of

straw, shredded leaves or other organic mulch helps keep soil moisture steady, reduces temperature swings, and prevents the hard crust that can form on bare soil. Mulch also suppresses weeds, which compete with vegetables for water and nutrients. Keeping weeds under control is essential in midsummer, when they grow just as fast as your crops. Pulling or hoeing them while they are small is far easier than waiting until they take hold.

Healthy foliage is essential to a productive garden, so take time to look closely at your plants each time you visit the garden. Leaves that yellow, curl or develop spots may be signaling stress, nutrient issues, insect feeding or disease. Many summer diseases spread quickly when leaves stay wet for long periods, so avoid overhead watering when possible and try not to handle plants when they are wet. Good air circulation also helps leaves dry faster, so give plants enough space and remove any dense weeds growing around them.

Summer is also peak

season for insect activity. Some insects cause only minor cosmetic damage, but others — like squash vine borers, tomato hornworms, and cucumber beetles — can cause serious harm if not caught early. There is real value in regular scouting: walking through the garden, turning over leaves and checking stems for eggs or feeding damage. Early detection allows gardeners to remove pests by hand or use targeted treatments before problems spread. Beneficial insects such as lady beetles and lacewings can also help keep pest populations in check, so avoid broad, unnecessary pesticide use that might harm them.

Finally, remember that summer care is about consistency rather than intensity. A few minutes every couple of days checking soil moisture, pulling a handful of weeds, looking under leaves and removing and disposing of damaged plant parts goes a long way. Gardens that receive steady attention are far less likely to experience major outbreaks of pests or disease, and they bounce back more quickly from heat stress or dry weather. A little care now leads to

Lucio Sanchez-Basan, 21, of Grayson, initially booked as John Doe in some third-party databases, was arrested and booked into the detention center sometime before noon on Monday on charges of alcohol intoxication in a public place, menacing, and tampering with physical evidence.

In addition to being initially booked without valid identification, Sanchez-Basan was also incorrectly identified as Lucio Sanchez-Crescencio for a brief period on the detention center website before his name was corrected. His profile on the detention center’s JailTracker site also showed a hold on Sanchez-Basan by Immigration Custom Enforcement following the update. The reason for the hold was listed as deportation.

Shortly after the primary suspect in the case, Adio Sanchez Crescencio, 21, also of Grayson, was booked into the detention center on charges of attempted murder and tampering with physical evidence.

There was no indication from police statements of what may have led to the stabbing incident.

The Carter County Times has reached out to Assistant Chief Smith for more details and will update the story as new information is available.

spots.”

Boggs explained that most things to do with the jail have a “shelf life” of about 20 years.

“Right now, we’re working on year 24,” he said. “The roof is four years past its time, and we are going to have to replace it.”

Boggs said that water from the leaking roof is running down the jail walls in places and potentially damaging other things. Boggs said the water hasn’t “helped” the 20-year-old system that controls the doors and other things at the jail.

“That (the controls) is another thing we need to address as early as possible,” Boggs told the court. “We need to get an updated bid on that, but we have a battery backup that handles control, which is every door for every room in the Jail. Without it, everyone is stuck and locked in if the electric goes out.”

Boggs said he had planned to get an updated bid soon on the control and bring it before the court. But, he stressed, the immediate need was the roof. The fiscal court voted to advertise the roof replacement and to open it up for bids.

In other business, Carter County Judge Executive Brandon Burton told the court that he would like to have a work session in the near future and examine the current county ordinances. Burton said that there might be a need to revise certain ordinances, such as the ordinance concerning animal control.

“It’s getting out of hand,” Burton told the court. “I am getting a lot of complaints, and hopefully in the next couple of weeks we can look at that ordinance.”

The fiscal court also voted to approve the LARP (Local Assistance Road Program) Agreement, and to approve Resolution 452. The court held the second reading of ordinances number 867 and 868. The court also voted to accept Autmn Lane into the county road maintenance schedule, pending a center lane survey.

The fiscal court also discussed taking bids to demolish the old jail adjacent to the courthouse.

“It is falling in anyway,” Judge Executive Burton told the court. “And it’s time to get something done.”

Burton cited the need for more space, as well as the old building having become a danger and compromising the surrounding structures.

“We are getting a big sinkhole in the back parking lot,” Burton said. “And the building is just too far gone.”

The fiscal court voted unanimously to begin the bid process for demolition of the structure.

Council discusses water grants and fireworks concerns

The Grayson City Council began its regular scheduled meeting last Tuesday, July 14, with the public comments section, hearing concerns over individual fireworks displays within the city limits. The council was presented with video evidence of a large display that had been set off, with falling debris striking several homes near where the display was set off. The time stamp on the video clearly showed that the display occurred after the deadline stipulated in the city noise ordinance.

The council assured the concerned citizens that the matter would be examined to see what could be done to prevent both the noise and property damage in the future. Steps taken could include an updated ordinance that could include fines for violations. Said fines could be levied against the offending parties, as well as increased fines applied for repeat violations. One possible solution discussed was requiring anyone wishing to set off fireworks within the city limits to purchase a permit through the city. Property damage, regard-

League of Women Voters denounces President's election claims

WASHINGTON — The League of Women Voters issued the following statement from CEO Celina Stewart following President Donald Trump’s address to the nation Thursday evening:

“The League of Women Voters strongly denounces President Trump’s false, outlandish, and indefensible claims related to the security of US elections. Continuing to spread allegations that have been repeatedly debunked by experts through countless court proceedings not only erodes public confidence in the democratic process but also further weakens the institutions that protect our freedom to vote. This is yet another brazen attempt to undermine elections and suppress voter turnout.

“Our elections and national security have been protected because of agencies such as the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and the US Election Assistance Commission (EAC), both of which had their leadership dismantled by the Trump administration. You cannot claim to defend election integrity while blatantly dismantling it and firing the independent experts whose very job it is to protect it.

“It is vital the American people realize that the administration’s goal with this address was to create a new avenue to pass the SAVE Act yet again, after it failed three times in Congress. This bill would strip the right to vote from 70 million American women and cripple the American election system for personal political gain. When public trust in elections is deliberately undermined, and when millions of eligible voters are in danger of losing their right to vote, the damage extends far beyond a single speech or election cycle.

“This is a perilous inflection point for our democracy. By urging Americans to doubt whether their votes count, whether certified election results reflect the will of the people, and whether our system can endure, the president is eroding the foundations of self-government. Most troubling, his speech deliberately sowed suspicion among neighbors and communities, weakening the trust and shared commitment that make democratic life possible.

“Make no mistake: this is a deliberate, dangerous, and desperate attempt to spread doubt not only about the 2020 election and the verified integrity of our election process, but about any future election whose outcome President Trump refuses to accept. As our nation prepares for the November midterm elections, we call on leaders at every level to remember their constitutional duties and oaths of office and uphold their responsibility to strengthen our democracy by speaking truthfully about our elections. And we call on voters to show up to the November midterms in record numbers, so there can be no doubt, once and for all, that Americans are committed to electing a government that serves all of us, not just some of us.”

The League of Women Voters, a nonpartisan political organization, encourages the informed and active participation of citizens in government, works to increase understanding of major public policy issues, and influences public policy through education and advocacy. As a nonpartisan body, the League takes action on issues but does not support or oppose candidates or parties. The League supports diversity, equity and inclusion in membership and programming.

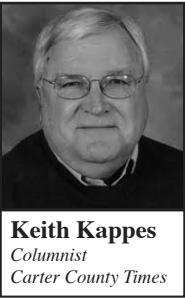

And now, we’re dangling on the edge of another war that feels like it will go on forever. More service members were killed. Trump thought he could waltz into Iran and make a big splash, being the tough guy, and yet, he did nothing but show the weaknesses in our military, our leadership, and his judgment. The tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof provided, however, that in each year to the extent that the other taxes or revenues of the District are available for the payment of the Lease Payments and are appropriated for such purpose, the amount of such direct tax upon all of the taxable property in the District shall be reduced by the amount of such other taxes or revenues so available and appropriated.

There is hereby established, or it is acknowledged that there has heretofore been established, with the Lessee a sinking fund (the "Sinking Fund"), which is hereby ordered to be continued and maintained as long as the Lease shall remain outstanding. less of any existing ordinance, could be addressed through the court system. In other business, Grayson Utilities Director Gerald Haney presented updates on utility projects to the city council. “We had applied for a bunch of grants over the past year or so,” Haney told the council. “One of the grants we found out recently we have been approved for was an ARC (Appalachian Regional Commission) Grant.” The grant, Haney said, was \$412,000, with matching funds of \$103,000 required. “What that is going to do is allow us to paint three of the steel tanks,” Haney told the council. “We have seven storage tanks, and three of them are the steel tanks. They (the steel tanks) will get repainted, and we are going to put emergency generators at two of the pump stations.” Haney said the first of the three tanks in question was the tank located on Paradise Hill. “It is the most visible on you can see,” Haney told the council. “There isn’t much surface area, but the word ‘Grayson’ is painted on it.” Haney said the last time the tank was painted was in 2014 and has been at

that location since 1971. The tank holds 60,000 gallons of water and provides pressure to Paradise Hill and the western portion of Grayson, Haney said. A short distance down the road from this tank is another steel water tank with a 300,000-gallon capacity as well as a concrete tank, Haney said. That will be the second steel tank to be repainted, having previously been painted in 2011. “The third steel tank to be repainted is on the east part of Main Street,” Haney told the council. “It was also painted in 2011, but it needs repainting more than the others because it is starting to show rust and is down to the primer.” Haney also informed the council of other grants the utilities commission had submitted. “A couple of other items we have submitted for are a water line replacement on US 60, and a new line on B and L Lane,” Haney said. “The other one is a FEMSA (Fire and Emergency Manufacturers and Services Association) Grant for safety. So, we are doing some stuff so we can locate gas lines better.” Haney told the council that, if the grant was approved, the work would entail adding GPS (Global Positioning System) to the

lines and adding a transmitter as well. *Contact the writer at charles@cartercountytimes.com*

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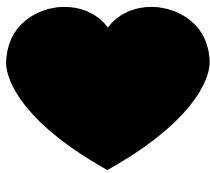
